OHSAA-OHIO HS SPORTS.COM DISSOLVE CONTRACT—For a variety of reasons, the Ohio High School Athletic Association and Ohio HS Sports.com have dissolved the contract that gave the exclusive audio and video rights for state tournament coverage to Ohio HS Sports.com. This move allows The Voice of Holmes County.com to webcast from any and all state tournament events and lifts the exclusion that existed under the contract. Obviously, this is good news for us and others who wanted to cover their local teams on the internet but were not allowed to do so. Let me make clear that our opposition had nothing to do with the outcome directly but may influence where this all goes from here. The Voice and others around the state raised many strong objections to this “exclusivity” and that may well guide the OHSAA’s thinking in the future about entering into such agreements. One other thing I want to make clear. I was very critical of the OHSAA in writings when this all occurred (*see Sunday, March 9, 2009 entry*). I want to equally praise the Association now for listening to what we had to say. I met on numerous occasions in person and by phone with a variety of OHSAA officials. Each time, they listened, spent considerable time with me, and went out of their way to help us within the limitations of the contract. Commissioner Dan Ross, Associate Commissioner Bob Goldring and, especially, Director of Information Services Tim Stried, could not have been more open to discussion and willing to take the time to do so. They were under no obligation to do that and I am appreciative of their willingness to repeatedly discuss the situation. Stried details the need for corporate partners for the OHSAA in a recent interview which you can find here:

We understand and agree that corporate partners are needed in this day of tough economic times. But we also believe there are ways to achieve this without exclusivity

It is good to have all this behind us and move forward. Again, my thanks to the OHSAA officials who offered their time and willingness to discuss this difficult issue. Friday, October 30, 2009

FAIRGROUNDS/EXPO CENTER PROPOSAL—This week, Holmes County received a gift that could pay dividends in many ways for years to come. The donation of land by Paul Weaver to the Holmes County Fair Board has paved the way for the moving of the Fairgrounds and the construction of a new expo center. It's an opportunity that must not be missed.

I am hopeful the community will see that the time has come and work together to make this a reality because it will take the entire community getting behind the effort to make it happen. The Fair Board cannot do this alone. Holmes County Commissioners have pledged moral support but no money because of dwindling county coffers. The Holmes County Chamber, who will work to establish the expo center, cannot do it without help. It will take government, business and private citizens to complete moving the fairgrounds and building the expo center—it is that simple. No one entity is going to take this on and finish it on its own.

So why is this so urgently need? Because not having a viable Fairgrounds area and an exposition center is costing Holmes County money. And, every day that goes by, means more money out the window. The potential economic and related benefits to Holmes County cannot be ignored. The now defunct Holmes County Expo Center proved, in just a single year of existence, that an expo center will fly.....and fly high. Over \$5 million dollars of economic impact was realized when that center was operating.

There are many organizations who want to come here and will if the new center is built. Some have had to leave because there is no facility here. That needs to be remedied. When towns, cities and villages across the country are scratching, clawing and begging for this type of business, it is unthinkable not to find a way to build a facility here when you already have people knocking on your door. Some communities cannot attract convention-type business no matter what they do. All we have to do is provide the facility and they will come. They are waiting to do so right now and Holmes County needs their business.

The current Fairgrounds area is an economic dead-end and a disaster waiting to happen. A flash flood on the fairgrounds, during a fair, would be a catastrophe this county does not want penned in the chapters of its history. No government agency is going to provide grant money for the current fairgrounds for either improvements or replacement of flood-damaged buildings. It has to come out of the fair board's pocket and that's money down the drain at a site exposed to flood damage, at any given time.

There is no where to go with it. It has reached the end of its useful life. It cannot be expanded, improved, used in the off-season or provide any other benefit that can be mined for the greater good.

A new Fairgrounds location provides improved facilities. A commercial building will bring vendors back to the fair when they no longer have to be worried about their items being in tents and exposed to the elements. Built from the ground up, a new Fairgrounds area can be designed for year-round use, rented out, and utilized to provide much needed income to help the fair board put on the best fair it can year after year. It can be a showcase for the state's best Junior Fair for one-week a year, and provide a revenue generating facility for the other 51 weeks.

It will provide new multi-use buildings with pens that can be moved and removed for whatever purpose the building needs to serve. It is an upgrade that is badly needed for the fair and is not possible on the current grounds.

These are just a few examples. Track improvements, parking improvements...the list goes on and on...all possible in a new location, none possible in the current one.

But none of this will happen if we spend our time debating whether or not it should. It should. Not in five or ten years. Now...or as soon as possible. There will never be a better opportunity. The project's wheels are in motion. They need to pick up speed, not travel in fits and starts. In tough economic times, communities need to help themselves and do whatever they can to generate income. Here's an opportunity to do so. The spin-off money potential from having these new facilities could be immense.

The challenges of pulling it off are great; challenges that will demand time, cooperation and commitment; challenges that will require creative solutions; and challenges that aren't yet known. But I've never known this county, in my time here, to back down from a challenge. Rather, I have watched it come together to meet a challenge head-on. It's part of what makes Holmes County...Holmes County.

Forty years ago, a flood destroyed the current fairgrounds. Forty years from now, or sooner, people are going to look back at the time when we stood at the cross roads of this opportunity. Will they speak of how we had the vision and foresight to capitalize on the moment? Or will they shake their heads in wonder of how such a golden opportunity could have been missed?

This is the ONLY way we can bring our call of the state game to you at this time. You must access it by cell phone. There will be no way to access it on the site due to contract restrictions. We have been working diligently to bring you all the coverage we can and for those who wish to hear our call of the game, there is now a way to do so. THE BEST WE CAN DO: We are announcing today that The Voice Of Holmes County.com has reached an agreement with OhioHSSports.com to bring you video and audio coverage of ALL games in this year's girls state tournament. You will find a link on our website to a page on our website that will allow you to watch and listen to the games as covered by the exclusive rights holder, OhioHSSports.com

As I informed you last week, we are barred from doing play-by-play coverage of the state tournament due to the OHSAA contracting out the exclusive internet audio and video rights. You can read the details in the posting below this one so I won't go there.

We promised to do the best we could under the circumstances and we are going to follow through. While we strongly oppose the whole idea of anyone being barred from covering their local teams as they have all year, we also feel that we must do the best we

can by our kids, our community and our clients. Thus, we will be bringing you the state games the only way we can.

In addition, I have agreed that if we have a team in the championship game, I will appear as a guest on the OhioHSSports.com pre-game, half-time and post-game shows as a commentator representing our team.

We also plan other coverage surrounding the state tournament. Watch the site for further information.

Both the OHSAA and the rights holder understand that we completely and totally oppose this exclusivity agreement that provides no provision for local media and will continue to do so. However, we will put the dispute aside for the now until the tournaments have concluded, and work for changes in the future. To do anything else would not be fair to the kids, the community or the clients we serve.

Sunday, March 9, 2009

NO STATE TOURNAMENT FOR US: I had hoped I would not have to write this but it appears I do. Should any of our teams advance to the state tournament, we will NOT be able to webcast the play-by-play of their games. Why? Because the OHSAA has signed a 5-year contract granting exclusive internet audio and video rights to Cleveland.com and related partners.

I knew this was likely when I launched the website, and informed those who advertise with us before they agreed to be sponsors so they would know the likelihood up front. I knew that because we were making sure we were following all the rules and regulations before I embarked on this endeavor by checking with the OHSAA first. I had hoped there might be some sort of licensing system or waiver system introduced if the contract was signed, which it was. Not the case, as of this writing.

Let me be clear on a couple of things. The first is simple...I don't believe ANY media outlet should have exclusivity at ANY high school event. Period. I didn't agree when they did it with the TV contract, I don't agree now, and I will be just as opposed if they take this route with the remaining media—which to a certain extent, they already

have. Radio stations who were also carrying the state games on the internet are now prohibited from doing so.

The second thing I want to be sure is understood is that I have no problem with the OHSAA or any of their partners. I have a problem with THIS decision and direction. I have served for the last several years on the OHSAA Media Advisory Committee, have made a lot of friends within the organization, and have developed a good relationship with the Commissioner, several Associate Commissioners and others within the OHSAA. The organization has been good to me. I have tried to be good to it, follow the rules, and promote high school athletics in a positive way.

I met personally with the OHSAA Commissioner Dr. Dan Ross, Associate Commissioner Bob Goldring, and Director of Information Services Tim Stried on Jan. 29 to voice the position that this whole exclusivity idea was unfair to local media who had covered their teams all year long. While all three understood the point, and offered other ideas as far as covering the state tournament, there has been no movement toward changing the situation---as of this writing. That is not to say it can't yet happen, it just appears that it won't. And, no, we can't record and run the games after the fact or post them so our listeners could listen later. Exclusive means exclusive.

It strikes me as VERY ironic that the organization that promotes inclusion, fair play, competition, and sportsmanship, didn't seem to feel that applied when the TV deal and, now, the internet deal was signed. Just a side note...I received an email Feb. 20th from the OHSAA asking us to help promote the sale of the tickets that had not been sold yet for the state tournament games. How ironic is that? Let me see... I'm not invited to the party but you want me to help sell the invitations?

Nonetheless, it is what it is. We will do what we can within the confines that have been imposed upon us, if any of our teams qualify. I just wanted you to know that it isn't that I don't want to do the state tournament games....it's that I can't. I've done nearly 65 high school basketball webcasts to this point but I'm prohibited from carrying the biggest games of the year. Inclusion? Fair play? In this case, I think not.
